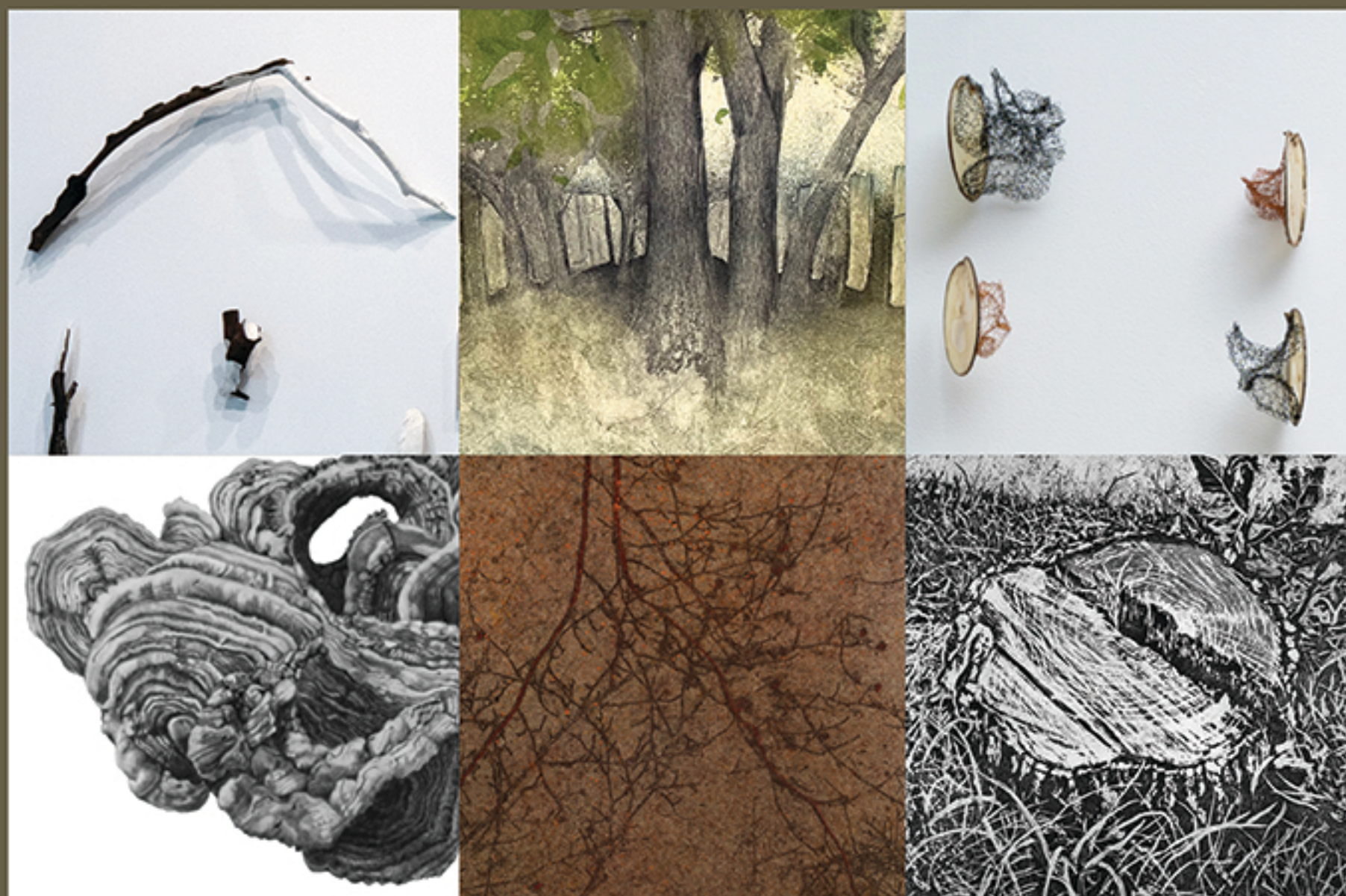


When Trees Dream
