

The Global Advocacy Certificate Program (GACP) is for ASU faculty and staff who desire to cultivate a globally-minded campus. Participants will broaden their awareness of intercultural topics and learn specific strategies for supporting culturally and linguistically diverse (CLD) students and scholars in the classroom and workplace to promote a more diverse community for all.

All ASU faculty and staff — including GACP certificate holders—are invited to attend workshops for ongoing learning, regardless of their intentions to receive a certificate. Participation will be recorded as professional development training on ASU's Career Edge.

BECOME A GLOBAL ADVOCATE

To earn a certificate as a Global Advocate, participants must register for and attend the Foundations of Global Advocacy core course *plus* at least three elective courses during an academic year. All courses are free of charge and fill on a first-come, first-served basis. Participants can earn certificates every year.

Participants in GACP Workshops will learn:

- awareness of international campus resources for students, staff, and faculty
- strategies to serve as resources for international students
- proficiencies to identify and navigate cultural and linguistic diversity

INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE STUDENT PANEL Thursday, April 8, 2021 | 11:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.

DESCRIPTION: Graduate students will share about their educational backgrounds and their experiences while at ASU. The workshop will include a reflective activity on empathy and awareness.

ADVANCED GLOBAL ADVOCACY CERTIFICATE PROGRAM—FALL OR SPRING

REQUIREMENTS: Advanced GACP workshops are offered to participants who already have completed the GACP; participants must attend all three advanced workshops to receive an Advanced Certificate in Global Advocacy. They are encouraged, but not required, to attend GACP electives. Participants can enroll in the Advanced GACP during fall or spring and can earn advanced certificates every year.

DESCRIPTION: To develop a community of practice, Advanced GACP participants will apply three Cultural Intelligence capabilities—Cultural Openness, Cultural Awareness, and Cultural Responsiveness—to help solve a problem of practice within their workplaces. During these workshops, participants will work together in applying knowledge they have learned through attendance at previous and current GACP sessions to solution design for an identified problem and then evaluate the solution's effectiveness.
