



Global Advocacy Certificate Program

The Global Advocacy Certificate Program (GACP) is for ASU faculty and staff who wish to cultivate a globally-minded campus. By attending a series of workshops, participants will broaden their awareness of intercultural topics and learn specific strategies for supporting international students and scholars in the classroom and workplace and promoting a more diverse community for all.

BECOME A GLOBAL ADVOCATE

To earn a certificate as a Global Advocate, participants must register for and attend the Foundations of Global Advocacy core course *plus* at least three elective courses during an academic year. All courses are free of charge and fill on a first-come, first-served basis.

Participants in Global Advocacy Workshops will learn:

- awareness of international campus resources for students, staff, and faculty
- strategies to serve as resources for international students
- proficiencies to identify and navigate cultural and linguistic diversity

APPLYING CULTURAL INTELLIGENCE ADVANCED WORKSHOPS

Participants who already have received a certificate during prior GACP workshop series are invited to join the program in subsequent years. Instead of attending the Foundations of Global Advocacy Core Course, participants are required to attend the Applying Cultural Intelligence Advanced Workshops.

Description: This introductory session will familiarize participants with the GACP by offering an overview of ASU's international population and its vision for and efforts in internationalization, facilitating activities to allow people to determine their worldviews and build Cultural Intelligence (CQ), and providing strategies for advocating for and engaging students. Special emphasis will be placed on understanding and developing a culture of intersectionality and global citizenship.

APPLYING CULTURAL INTELLIGENCE ADVANCED WORKSHOPS—FALL OR SPRING

Advanced workshops are offered only to participants who already have completed the GACP certificate program; advanced participants do not have to attend the Foundations of Global Advocacy Workshops, but they must attend at least three workshops during the current season in addition to these advanced workshops to receive an advanced certificate. Participants can enroll in the advanced workshops during fall or spring and select from *any* elective workshop in either semester.

To develop a community of practice, participants will apply the four Cultural Intelligence steps—drive, knowledge, strategy, and action—to help solve a problem of practice within their workplaces. During these workshops, participants will work together in applying knowledge they have learned through attendance at previous and current GACP workshops to solution design for an identified problem and then evaluate the solution's effectiveness.
