novelist Kim Zarins (author of *Sometimes We Tell the Truth*) bringing Chaucer's narratives into twenty-first-century experience.

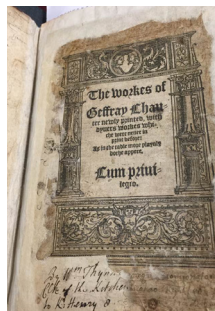
