

## Julius Rosenwald: Northern Jewish Philanthropy for African Americans and the Dilemma of Southern Jews

How did the work of northern Jewish philanthropists and activists complicate the lives of southern Jews, a group of women and men who since the eighteenth century found a way to live with the dictates of regional life? 
