Urban Trinity: The Story of Catholic Philadelphia Film Screening and Q&A with producer Katie Oxx

Urban Trinity, a 2015 film from the Philadelphia-based EMMY-award-winning History Making Productions, is the first documentary film to capture the history of the Catholic community in one city. Though it focusses on Philadelphia, *Urban Trinity* captures the narrative arc of the American Catholic story and places the contemporary challenges and opportunities confronting American Catholics in historical context. The title, *Urban Trinity*, reflects the unique relationship between the people, the church, and the city that is at the heart of the film - a dramatic and inspiring story that reflects the experiences of countless Americans from diverse backgrounds.

At Saint Joe's, she teaches "Religion and Race in Philadelphia" and a variety of courses in the history of Christianity and Catholicism.
